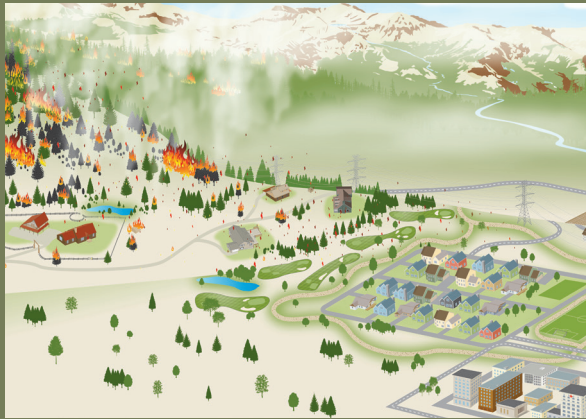

Land Use Planning Assistance to Reduce Wildfire Risks to Communities



Consulting services to better plan the wildland-urban interface (WUI), including:

- Land use planning recommendations,
- Training and peer-to-peer learning opportunities,
- Development of local wildfire hazard maps,
- Customized research, resources, and tools.

The Community Planning Assistance for Wildfire (CPAW) program works with communities to reduce wildfire risks through improved land use planning. Assistance comes at no cost to the community and recommendations are adopted at the discretion of local jurisdictions. We are now accepting applications from eligible communities for 2020.

CPAW is a national program that was founded in 2014 by Headwaters Economics and Wildfire Planning International. To date, the program has engaged with 55 communities in 20 states. CPAW is funded by grants from the U.S. Forest Service and private foundations.

Application Details

- Eligible communities include U.S. cities, towns, tribal communities, and counties that have authority over local land use and zoning decisions.
- Applications must be submitted jointly by the community planning and fire departments.
- Communities should be willing to commit staff time and enter into a Memorandum of Understanding.
- Complete and submit the application by **October 18, 2019**. All applicants will be notified by November 27, 2019, of their final selection status.
